





MATHS

- Geometry: compare shapes based on properties, find unknown angles, calculate area and volume
- Statistics: interpret and construct pie charts and line graphs and use them to solve problems

Homework:

- Year 6 children will be provided with 3 study guides/revision books. One for maths, grammar and reading.
- They will be assigned pages to complete, which will match the work that they are currently studying in class.
- This will help to reinforce their learning and give them extra opportunities to work on things that they may find difficult.
- These will be marked in class and used as a revision/teaching tool to resolve any misconceptions or to secure learning.

Homework continued:

- Grammar will be set on a Friday and due in on the following Friday.
- Maths will be set on a Thursday and due in on a Tuesday.
- Reading will be set every other week on a Wednesday and due in on a Wednesday.
- As the children are now in Year 6, I will make sure that they are very aware of when their homework is set and when it is due in. They will need to become more responsible with managing their time and independent work as it will prepare them for next year.

We will use the online learning platform Purple Mash for our homework.

Spellings

All children receive a list of spellings on a Monday which they will practice daily in school. One of the Y6 writing objectives is consistent and correct use of Y5/6 spelling words in their writing. There will be a test in school during the last week of term that tests a selection of words from across the term.








Reading

Children are explicitly taught reading skills including skimming, scanning, text retrieval, inferring, deducing, analysing and evaluating.


They are then encouraged to apply these skills when reading independently and reading across the curriculum ROALD

Reading Every Day Goes a Very Long Way


Student A Reads

- 20 minutes per day

- 900 minutes per school year

Family Learning What's it all about?

- A National Programme, where a variety of courses are offered to schools to support parents/carers gain confidence to support their child's learning in a fun and friendly way.
- The courses and workshops will give you tips and activity ideas in various subjects.
- Courses and workshops range in a variety of subjects including 'Learning through play', 'Family Fun Outdoors', 'Phonics and story sacks' and 'Family maths'.



Family Learning

- Target Maths score 100% (3points)


Determination (1 point)

You are legally responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day and on time. Persistent lateness can add up to too many days absent.



weeks of school!


10 minutes late to school every day adds up. It is the same as losing 6.5 days of school each year.
