
This week in school......

Year 6 have had a very exciting start to their new English topic 'Romeo and Juliet' this week. On Tuesday morning they discovered a crime scene had been left for them to investigate; who left it there was a mystery! The children used their detective skills to identify key pieces of evidence that had been left at the scene including: outlines of a man and woman's body, a dagger, a syringe and poison bottle, an open window and a cup belonging to a member of staff! 


