




Let your light shine!

Maths

Music


Hearing colours: Next term, Year 5 will be exploring how music can be experienced visually by associating sounds and rhythms with different colours.

Science

This half term, we will focus on the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals. Year 5 will be investigating the different types of reproduction, including sexual and asexual reproduction. The children will be able to describe in depth how flowering plants reproduce and will be able to describe the parts of a flowering plant. We will then plan to clone a plant.



Computing

Year 5 will focus on the concept of selection in programming using the crumble kits. They will learn how to connect to a program components (including output devices such as LEDs and motors).




PE

Next term, Year 5 will be developing their skills in **rounders**, a fun and fast-paced team sport that improves both physical fitness and teamwork. These lessons will help build teamwork, communication, agility, and confidence.

Relationships: To be able to compare different types of friendships and the feelings associated with them. To be able to also explain how to stay safe when using technology to communicate with your friends, including how to stand up for yourself, negotiate and to resist peer pressure.

In Spanish this term we are going to learn about dates, birthdays and ages and communicating about family life and pets.



English

Year 5 will be writing a diary entry based on 'Rumaysa' - our class text. We will then use the same text to write a narrative with a particular focus on characterising speech. Our spelling focus for the term will be adding suffixes to the Year 5 and 6 common exception words.



RE

This term we will be continuing our topic: *Was Jesus the Messiah?* We will be furthering our previous learning and exploring questions such as 'was Jesus who he said he was?' and 'did the resurrection happen?' using evidence that supports this in the Bible (Matthew).
