- Home corner /polar explorers role play



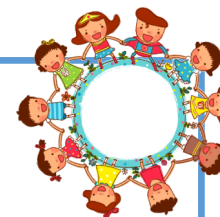

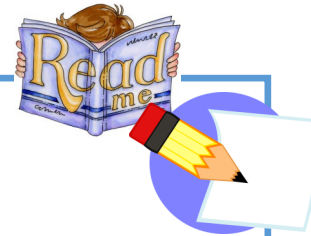
